Updated Public Records Law

The updates to the Massachusetts Public Records Law (Law) have now been in effect for a little over five years. Changes to the Law include: specified time periods for the Supervisor of Records (Supervisor) to issue



determinations on public records appeals, limits on fees permitted to be charged by government Records Access Officers (RAOs) and requirements for state agencies to track and report public records request information. 


