(formerly Dept. of Public Works) and, with some exceptions, state agencies within it; the Massachusetts Aeronautics Commission; the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority; the Massachusetts Port Authority; the Massachusetts Turnpike Authority; and any regional transportation authorities established pursuant to MGLA c 161B.

Historical Note:

St 1894, c 548, as amended by St 1897, c 500, incorporated the Boston Elevated Railway Company, to construct or lease and operate public transportation on street and elevated railway lines in Boston and adjoining communities, including in subways constructed in conjunction with the Boston Transit Commission. Sp St 1918, c 159 provided for public operation of the company through a gubernatorially appointed board of trustees.

St 1929, c 383 designated the company's scope of operations as a Metropolitan Transit District, Boston and thirteen surrounding municipalities, governed by trustees and a Metropolitan Transit Council. The district was administered by a Metropolitan Transit Dept., absorbing powers of the Boston Transit Dept. it acquired when the Boston Transit Commission was abolished by Sp St 1918, c 185.

St 1931, c 333 provided for public operation of the company until 1959, but St 1947, c 544 replaced the company and its trustees with and reconstituted the Metropolitan Transit District communities (although district trustees continued) as the Metropolitan Transit

Authority (MTA), a body politic and corporate and a political subdivision of the Commonwealth, also governed by a board of five gubernatorially appointed public trustees (reduced to three per St 1953, c 197). Per St 1949, c 572 the authority absorbed remaining powers of the Boston Transit Dept., which was abolished. St 1952, c 404 provided for an advisory board to the authority (see also St 1953, c 197, s 5)

St 1964, c 563 replaced the authority with the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority (MBTA), governed by a board of five gubernatorially appointed directors (see also St 1973, c 1140; per St 1980, c 581 increased to six with the secretary of transportation and construction as seventh director and chair) and an advisory board (see also St 1980, c 581, s 4), representing each of the fourteen district municipalities and an additional sixty-four (sixty-five since 1967; cf. St 1966, c 463; St 1967, c 87)

MTA/MBTA services have enlarged to include buses (from 1922), trackless trolley (from 1936), and commuter railway (from 1964--by operating agreement with Amtrak). MBTA functions are currently described in MGLA c 161A.

Historical Note:

St 1892, c 338 appointed a commission to investigate the condition of the roads Massachusetts, issue a report, and draft a bill providing for the improvement of the highways. This resulted in St 1893, c 476 (rev. St 1894, c 497), which established the Massachusetts Highway Commission, a procedure to designate state highways, and funding to be dispersed by the commission. The commission was responsible for assisting local governments with road design, construction, mapping and organization.

St 1919, c 350, ss 111-116 established the Dept. of Public Works, superseding the Massachusetts Highway Commission and the Commission on Waterways and Public Lands. The department was organized into a Division of Highways and a Division of Waterways and Public Lands. These divisions were consolidated pursuant to St 1927, c 297, which reorganized the department. A separate Division of Waterways was reestablished per St 1938, c 407. A Division of Public Beaches was established per St 1953, c 666, but it was abolished and its functions absorbed by the Division of Waterways per St 1958, c 640, ss 1-6 (from which they were then transferred to the Division of Forests and Parks in the Dept. of Natural Resources per St 1968, c 501, ss 1, 5-6)

Per St 1959, c 416, the Mass Transportation Commission was established within the department and abolished per St 1964, c 636, s 12. St 1963, c 821 again reorganized the department under the supervision and control of the Public Works Commission, adding divisions of administrative services, highway engineering, highway construction, and highway maintenance. St 1964, c 563, s 1 added a Bureau of Transportation Planning and Development.

St 1969, c 704, s 19 placed the department within the Executive Office of Transportation and Construction except for the Registry of Motor Vehicles (established per St 1946, c 234), removed from the department and placed in the Executive Office of Public Safety (ss 18, 20); the registry's Division of Motorboats (established per St 1963, c 821), placed in the Executive Office of Public Safety (s 18), renamed Division of Motor and Recreational Vehicles per St 1971, c 103, ss 1-2, and transferred from the Dept. of Public Works to the Dept. of Fisheries, Wildlife, and Recreational Vehicles per St 1974, c 806, s 1 and St 1975, c 706, s 17; and the Outdoor Advertising Board and Outdoor Advertising Division (established per St 1963, c 821), placed in the Executive Office of Environmental Affairs (s 15) and transferred from the Dept. of Public Works to the Dept. of Environmental Quality Engineering per St 1974, c 806, s 1.

The Division of Waterways was transferred to the Dept. of Environmental Quality Engineering per St 1974, c 806, s 1 and St 1975, c 706, s 14. The Bureau of Solid Waste Disposal (established per St 1969, c 834, s 1) was transferred to the Dept. of Environmental Management per St 1974, c 806, s 1. --St 1991, c 552, ss 6-7 (effective 1992) renamed the department as the Dept. of Highways (commonly called Massachusetts Highway Department) and the Public Works Commission as the Highways Commission.

St 2009, c 25 replaced the department with a Highway Division under the Dept. of Transportation.

The functions of the Highway Division, the development and maintenance of all state highways, are currently described in MGLA c 6C, c 16, and c 81.

Record Group Name: Government Center Commission

Historical Note:

Government Center, in downtown Boston, originated as an urban renewal project in the Scollay Square area, intended for new large-scale construction. Government involvement included the city (Boston Redevelopment Authority), the federal government, and the state government, which was represented by the Government Center Commission. St 1960, c 635 established the commission within the Dept. of Public Works, consisting of three gubernatorial appointees serving five-year terms. The commission was authorized to acquire land through the Boston Redevelopment Authority for the state, and to enter into contracts for the erection of state buildings. This act, and further provisions per St 1962, c 685, directed the commission to construct a health, welfare, and education service center consisting of: a mental health center and state laboratories building; an employment security building; and a health, welfare, and education building; also a state office building.

The service center was originally planned as three separate buildings designed by different architectural firms. Instead Paul Rudolph, coordinating architect for the project, joined the proposed three buildings, of which only two were built. The Division of Employment Security building, or the Charles F. Hurley Memorial State Office Building, (named for Charles F. Hurley, governor 1937-1939) was designed by Shepley, Bulfinch, Richardson, and Abbott, architects. The Eric Lindemann Mental Health Center was designed by Desmond and Lord, architects. Both buildings were constructed by the Vappi Construction Company and opened in 1971. The Health, Welfare, and Education Building, a proposed office tower for several state departments designed by M.A. Dyer with Pedersen and Tilney, architects, was approved but never built due to cost overruns.

The state office building, completed in 1966, was, per St 1968 c 743, named the Leverett Saltonstall Building for the former Massachusetts governor and United States senator; it was designed by Emery Roth & Associates, architects. St 1968, c 685 authorized the government center commission to develop a garage with an office building above. Completed in 1975, it became known as the John W. McCormack State Office Building. Originally the commission was to dissolve at the expiration of its members' terms. St 1964, c 649 provided for appointment of their successors for five years, and dissolution in 1970

or on completion of duties, whichever occurred first. St 1970, c 596 extended the 1970 deadline to 1975.

St 1941, c 695, providing for transfer of the Boston Airport (later General Edward Lawrence Logan Airport) from the city of Boston to the Commonwealth, established the

Bureau of Airport Management (s 14) within the Division of Waterways, Dept. of Public Works, to maintain and operate all airports owned and maintained by the Commonwealth. (The managerial role of the Massachusetts Aeronautics Commission established by St 1939, c 393, s 39 was reduced to an advisory one.) St 1946, c 582, s 5 made the bureau a separate unit in the Dept. of Public Works, limited to maintenance and operation of Logan Airport (other Commonwealth-owned airports to be managed by the Massachusetts Aeronautics Commission per s 4). St 1948, c 637 transferred these functions of the bureau (now discontinued) and the commission to a State Airport Management Board.

Massachusetts St 1948, c 637 transferred managerial functions of the Massachusetts Aeronautics Commission and functions of the Bureau of Airport Management to a State Airport Management Board, under a commissioner of airport management. The board was to assure the adoption and carrying out of sound business policies in the management and operation of Logan Airport and Hanscom Field and any other state-owned airport that might be established. It was abolished and absorbed into the Massachusetts Port Authority by St 1956, c 465 (revised by St 1959, c 599), effective Feb. 1959. Historical Note:

St 1952, c 354 created the Massachusetts Turnpike Authority, consisting of three gubernatorial appointees serving staggered eight-year terms, to construct, reconstruct, maintain, repair, and operate the Massachusetts Turnpike from the New York state line to the vicinity of Boston (later extended to downtown Boston); its powers includes the taking of state highways, acquisition of real property by purchase or eminent domain, issuance of revenue bonds, and collection of tolls. --St 1958, c 598 extended its jurisdiction to maintenance and operation of the vehicular tunnel (Sumner) between Boston proper and East Boston, and the construction of a second such tunnel (Callahan). The authority was designated a body politic and corporate and a public instrumentality, placed in but not subject to general jurisdiction of the Dept. of Public Works (Massachusetts Highway Dept. from 1992). St 1969, c 704, s 3 also placed it within the Executive Office of Transportation and Construction. Later it became responsible for the central artery/harbor tunnel project (1991-2007). It was discontinued and its functions transferred to the Dept. of Transportation (Highway Division) per St 2009, c 25.

St 1956, c 465 created the Massachusetts Port Authority (now commonly known as Massport), consisting of seven gubernatorial appointees serving staggered seven-year terms, to acquire through refinancing and to maintain and operate the following: from the City of Boston, the Sumner Tunnel from Boston to East Boston (this function, and that of constructing a second such tunnel were transferred by St 1958, c 598 and c 599 to the

Massachusetts Turnpike Authority); from the Mystic River Bridge Authority (to be dissolved), the Mystic River (now Tobin) Bridge (transferred to Dept. of Transportation per St 2009, c 25, s 147); from the Commonwealth, commercial facilities at the General Edward Lawrence Logan International Airport and Lawrence G. Hanscom Field (State Airport Management Board to be dissolved); from the Port of Boston Commission (to be dissolved), the lands and piers acquired and leased by the Commonwealth in the Port of Boston.

The authority's powers include acquisition of real property by purchase or eminent domain, issuance of revenue bonds, and collection of tolls. The authority is designated a body politic and corporate and a public instrumentality, placed in but not subject to general jurisdiction of the Dept. of Public Works (Massachusetts Highway Department from 1992). It became operational in Feb. 1959. St 1969, c 704, s 3 placed it within the Executive Office of Transportation and Construction. Its functions are currently described in MGLA c 91 App s 1-1 et seq.

St 1922, c 534 entrusted regulation of operation of aircraft to the registrar of motor vehicles, who appointed an advisory board of aeronautical experts to determine fitness for pilot licenses. St 1939, c 393 established the Massachusetts Aeronautics Commission, serving under the governor, to supervise and control all aeronautical activities and facilities in the Commonwealth, including management and maintenance of those owned or managed by the Commonwealth as otherwise provided by law. St 1941, c 695, s 13 limited such management and maintenance to advisory powers only, giving actual management powers to the Bureau of Airport Management (Division of Waterways, Dept. of Public Works)

St 1946, c 582 and c 583 reconstituted the commission, and restored to it managerial powers over airports owned by the Commonwealth (c 582, s 4) except as otherwise provided (i.e., Boston's Logan Airport under the Bureau of Airport Management (s 5)). St 1948, c 637 transferred all such functions to the State Airport Management Board (superseded by the Massachusetts Port Authority per St 1956, c 465, s 5)

St 1969, c 704, s 3 placed the commission within the Executive Office of Transportation and Construction. Its jurisdiction includes public use airports, seaplane bases, and private use landing areas. It is responsible for airport development and improvements, aviation safety, aircraft accident investigation, navigational aids, and statewide aviation planning. It certifies airports and heliports, licenses airport managers, conducts annual airport inspections, and enforces safety regulations. Its functions are currently described in MGLA c 6, ss 57-59 and c 90, ss 39-40.

St 1946, c 562 created the Mystic River Bridge Authority as a body politic and corporate and a public instrumentality consisting of four gubernatorial appointees serving staggered eight-year terms and the state commissioner of public works ex officio, to construct, maintain, repair, and operate the Mystic River (now Tobin) Bridge between Boston and Chelsea, Massachusetts; its powers included the acquisition of real property by purchase or eminent domain, issuance of revenue bonds, and collection of tolls. St 1956, c 465, which created the Massachusetts Port Authority, provided (as amended by St 1958, c 599) for the refunding by it of outstanding Mystic River Bridge revenue bonds, the subsequent dissolution of the Mystic River Bridge Authority, and the vesting of bridge title with the Massachusetts Port Authority, which process was completed in Feb. 1959. The membership was enlarged and responsibilities redefined by St 1938, c 453. St 1945, c 619 replaced the Boston Port Authority with the Port of Boston Authority, consisting of five gubernatorial appointees. St 1951, c 457 transferred from the authority to the Dept. of Public Works responsibility for certain sections of tidewater as specified in the act. St 1953, 608 replaced the Port of Boston Authority with the Port of Boston Commission, also consisting of five gubernatorial appointees. Per St 1956, c 465 (revised by St 1958, c 599), effective Feb. 1959, the Port of Boston Commission was absorbed into and replaced by the Massachusetts Port Authority.
