Notice is hereby given that the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MassDEP), in accordance with Chapter 8 of the Acts of 2021, is proposing to amend 310 CMR 7.00 Air Pollution Control to require a cumulative impact analysis for Comprehensive Plan Applications for facilities located in or near environmental justice populations. The proposed cumulative impact analysis regulations include enhanced public outreach to and involvement of environmental justice populations, assessment of existing community conditions, and analysis of cumulative impacts.

		The proposed amendments require any entity (which could include a small business) to conduct a cumulative impact analysis (CIA) for an application for a comprehensive plan approval that increases air pollutant emissions in or near environmental justice populations. If a small business becomes subject to the regulation, it would have to include a CIA report in the comprehensive plan approval application.

		Any affected small business would have to keep the CIA report as part of its comprehensive plan approval application records for five years.
