Describe the Scope and Objectives of the Regulation: 958 CMR 6.00 applies to all Provider Organizations subject to the requirements of M.G.L. c. 6D, §§ 11 & 12 and c. 12C, § 9. The proposed amended regulation implements Chapter 343 of the Acts of 2024 and makes operational updates and clarifications. The regulation establishes registration and reporting requirements for Provider Organizations, including which organizations must register and what information must be reported.

Business Industry(ies) Affected by the Regulation: 523940, 621111, 621112, 621330, 621410, 621420, 621491, 621493, 621498, 621511, 621512, 621910, 622110, 622210, 622310, 623110, 622220, Health Care Provider Organizations.

Types of Businesses Included in the Industry(ies): Provider Organizations with a net patient service revenue of \$25,000,000 or more; Provider Organizations certified as a risk-bearing provider organization by the Division of Insurance.
